Welcome to the North Shropshire Beekeepers' Association (NSBKA) which was founded on Friday 23 August 1945 and is, since our inception, a fully affiliated member of the British Beekeepers' Association (BBKA). We have members spread far and wide but predominantly across the northern part of the County.

The aims of the Association are to encourage and develop the art and science of bee keeping through group meetings, practical out apiary events and educational support programs in which members can participate and contribute.

Throughout the winter months (September– March), evening meetings are held where the very best speakers on bee keeping and associated activities are invited to share their specialist skills and knowledge at our monthly meeting, usually held at a local village hall. During the spring and summer months we gather at our Association apiary to perform general hive management tasks, observe and practice bee handling techniques and share our latest bee keeping tales in order that we can all improve our understanding of bees, their behaviour and maximize our efficacy in their on-going health and performance.

We try to run the Association with minimal formality and the only recorded event is our AGM in October of each year. We have a central committee of three (Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer) re-elected annually with a tenure of no more than four consecutive years. Membership of NSBKA

We have both beekeeping members and non-beekeeping members and our form is divided into 5 sections to help you find the correct membership category for you.

All beekeeping members must be BBKA members and have BDI (Bee Disease Insurance) either through our association or another association affiliated to the BBKA.

BBKA

Being a member of BBKA will give you access to the members area of the BBKA website where you can find information on bees and beekeeping, bee pests and diseases, beekeeping assessment's and module exams. All BBKA members receive insurance that covers your bee keeping activities for public and product liability up to the value of £10,000,000. You will receive a monthly copy of BBKA News.

BDI

BDI offers compensation for beekeepers whose colonies are destroyed by Bee Inspectors due to notifiable foul brood disease. As a Registered member you will be covered for up to 3 colonies. However, if you have or plan to have more than 3 colonies it is important to take out additional cover, prices can be found on the application form. If you are under insured, your policy will be invalidated, and you will not receive compensation should you be in the unfortunate position of losing your colonies to foul brood.

Membership type

Registered Member - beekeeping member, covers the majority of members and provides BBKA membership, minimum BDI and the NSBKA Beelines newsletter via email.

Partner Member – This category is for those beekeeping members who live at the same address as the registered member. They do not receive BBKA News but will receive NSBKA Beelines newsletter via email.

Country Member -non-beekeepers who nonetheless wish to support the BBKA, receives a copy of BBKA news and NSBKA Beelines newsletter via email, no insurance.

Junior Member -under 18, no insurance but receive BBKA news and NSBKA Beelines newsletter if an email address is provided. Under 16's must be accompanied to the association apiary by an adult.

Affiliated member – a member of another beekeeping association and pay for BBKA and BDI via that association, or for those who are interested in the craft of beekeeping but do not keep bees. Will receive a monthly copy of the NSBKA Beelines newsletter.

Bee Craft magazine.

Available through NSBKA with a reduced subscription, although this is an optional extra, we recommend that members, especially those new to beekeeping, take out this subscription. The cost on the form is the yearly subscription, for those joining after October please check the box on the last page for pro-rata rates.
